




# High interest, low ability






# Immersive Reader in Virtual Reality (Beta)

### Spelling check – Challenges for people with Dyslexia

#### **Challenges**

 Difficulty perceiving the differences & determining which is correct, in a list of similarly spelled words

2. Burdened by too many choices

3. Unique spelling error patterns


#### Traditional Office Spelling menu



- 1. No context or other cues to help choose the right word
- 2. Up to 5 different suggestions
- Prone to show "No Suggestions" for high editdistance errors


### Editor – Inclusive design to benefit everyone

- Contextual cues help people identify the right choice
  - 1. Synonyms help disambiguate between similar-looking suggestions
  - 2. Read Aloud (of both suggestions & synonyms) aids comprehension
- Better suggestions and significantly reduced incidence of "No Suggestions"
- Improved compatibility with screen readers and other ATs



## Editor Overview Pane: Find & Fix the issues you care about


- 1. A categorised Overview of writing enhancement opportunities
  - Corrections are issues you're strongly advised to fix
  - Refinements give optional advice on stylistic or situational matters
  - Counters and Checkmarks track progress & celebrate achievement
- 2. Draws attention to elements of Good Writing
  - Gives students a dashboard for self-assessment
  - Gives teachers a scorecard to drive **learning goal conversations**
  - Presents the breadth and depth of checks in a manageable way
- 3. Flexible Workflow choices let you spend time purposefully
  - Scrub the document one Category at a time
  - Fix in a recommended **sequence**: Spelling > Grammar > Refinements
  - Focus attention on Categories important for your Writing Goals





## Early Feedback

I was working with a **student** (with dyslexia) last week who was trying to put together his resume. About 10 minutes in, he felt so defeated because his **errors** felt like roadblocks. He **knew what he wanted to say**, he just **couldn't get the words close enough** and he wanted to give up.

This feature (Editor) opened a door for him, it allowed him to **focus on the content and ideas** he was trying to get down. The **options** and **synonyms** gave him i**ndependence** to not have to ask, or have someone sit by him and coach him through the entire document.








Word Prediction, Windows 10






