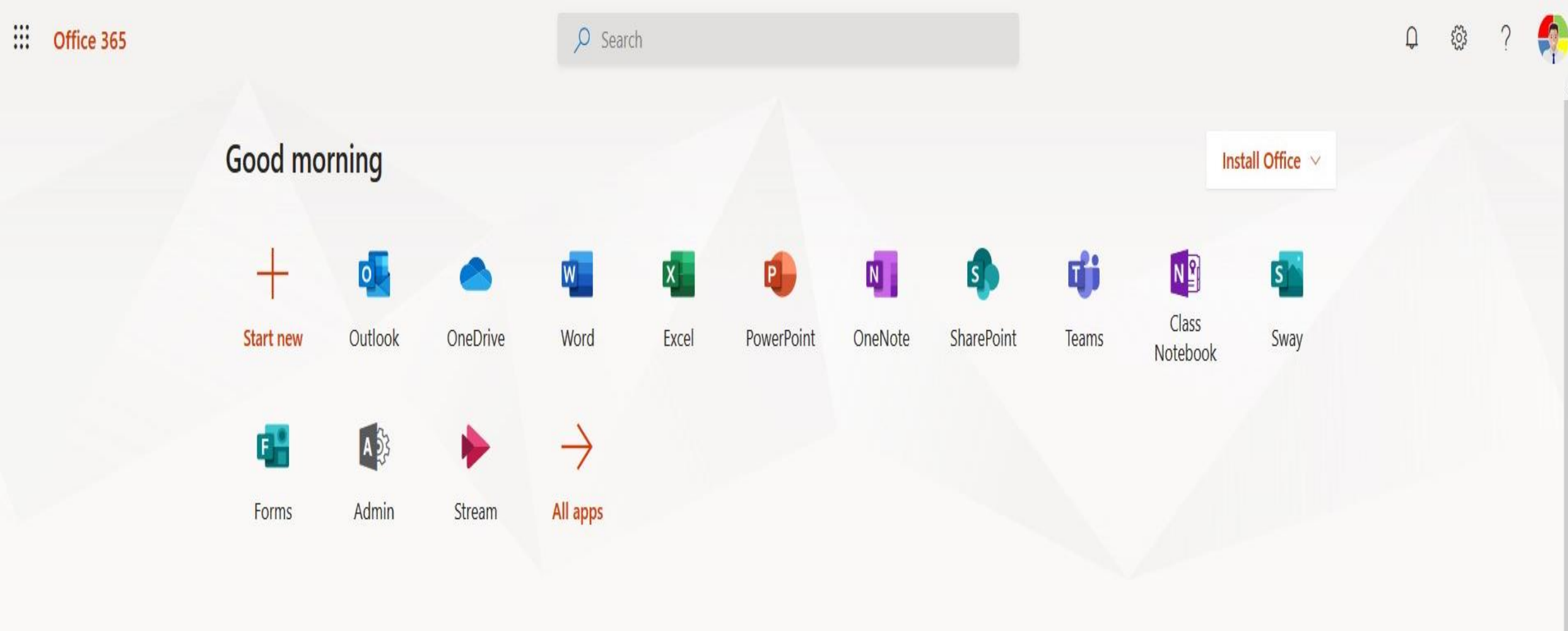

- ✓ Assist students to self-assess their writing... clearly see what to work on

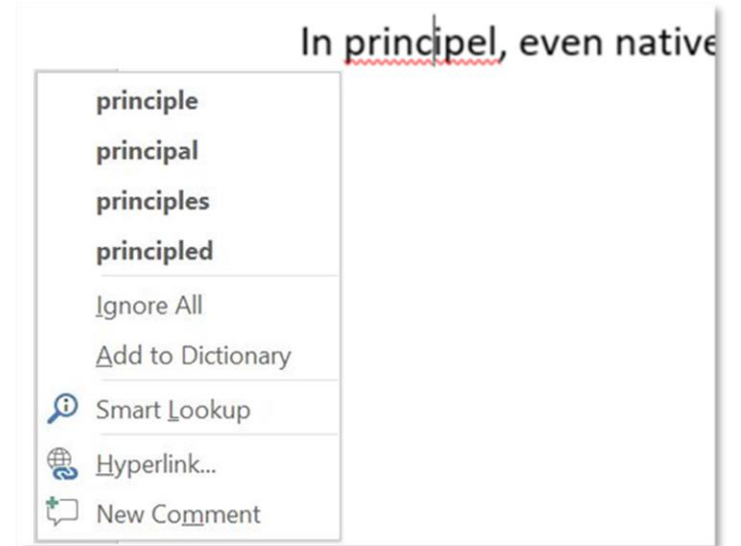


Spelling check – Challenges writers

Challenges

1. Difficulty **perceiving the differences & determining which is correct**, in a list of similarly spelled words
2. Burdened by too many choices
3. Unique spelling error patterns

Traditional Office Spelling menu



1. No context or other cues to help choose the right word
2. Up to 5 different suggestions
3. Prone to show “No Suggestions” for high edit-distance errors

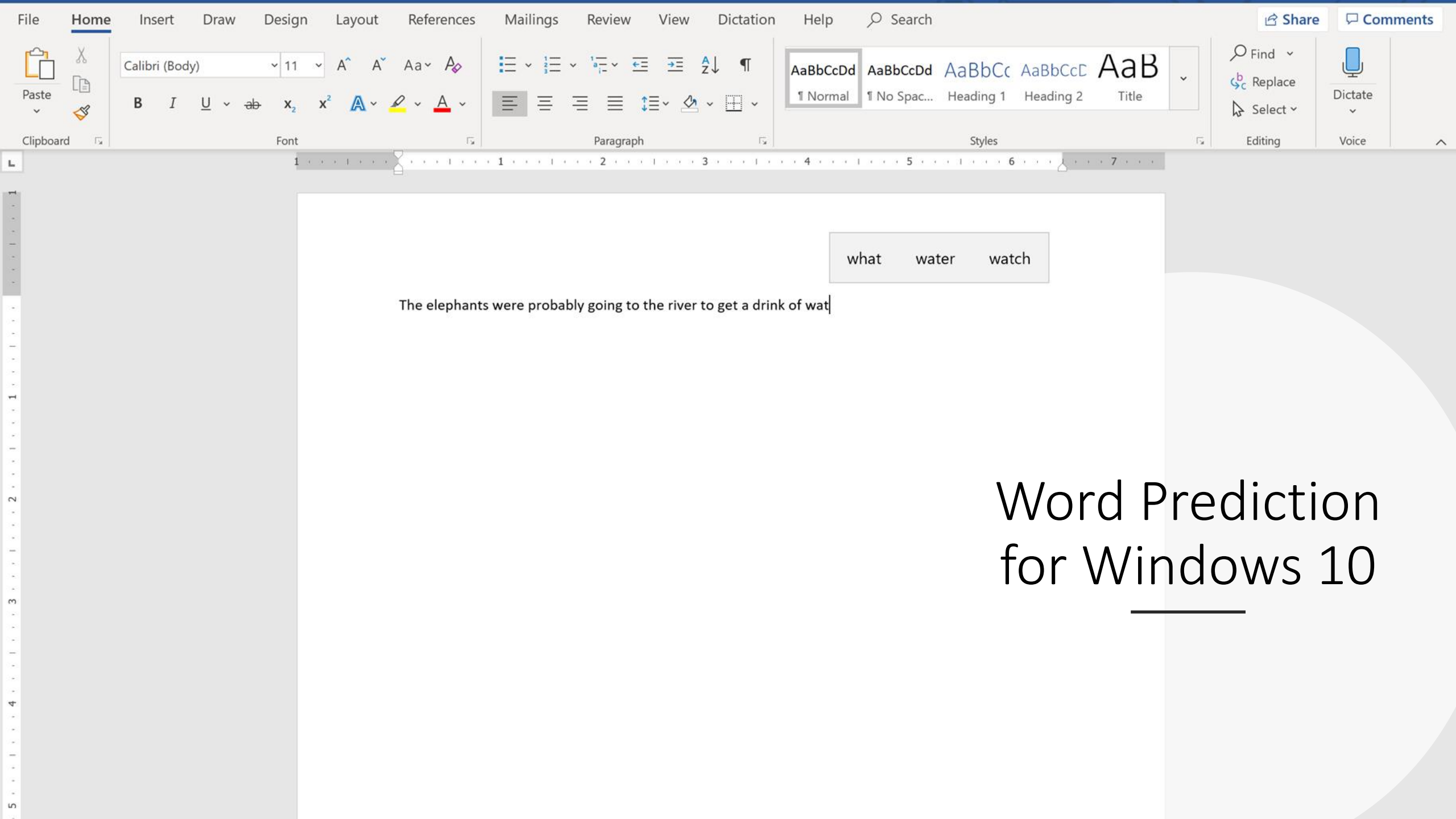

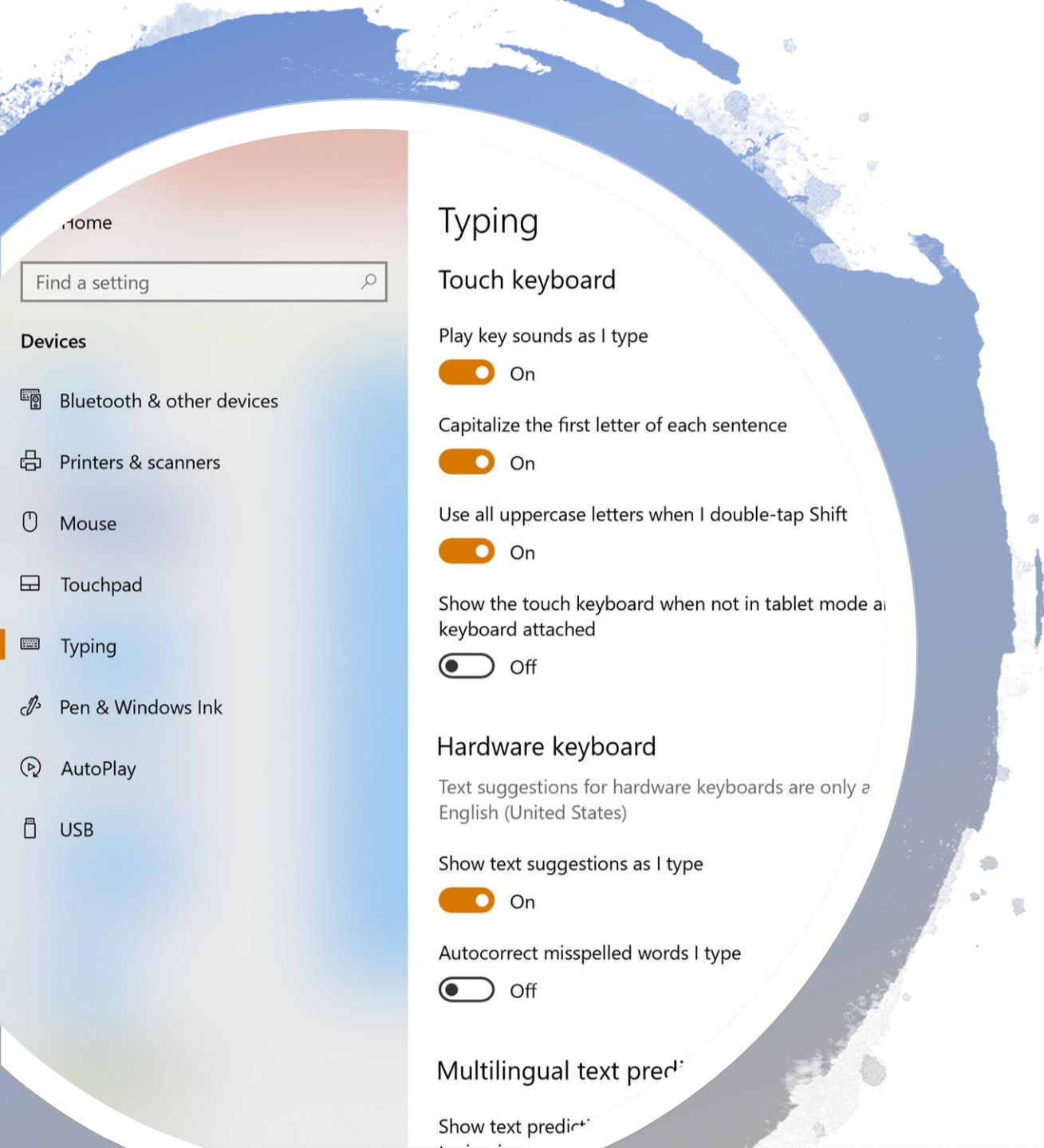
