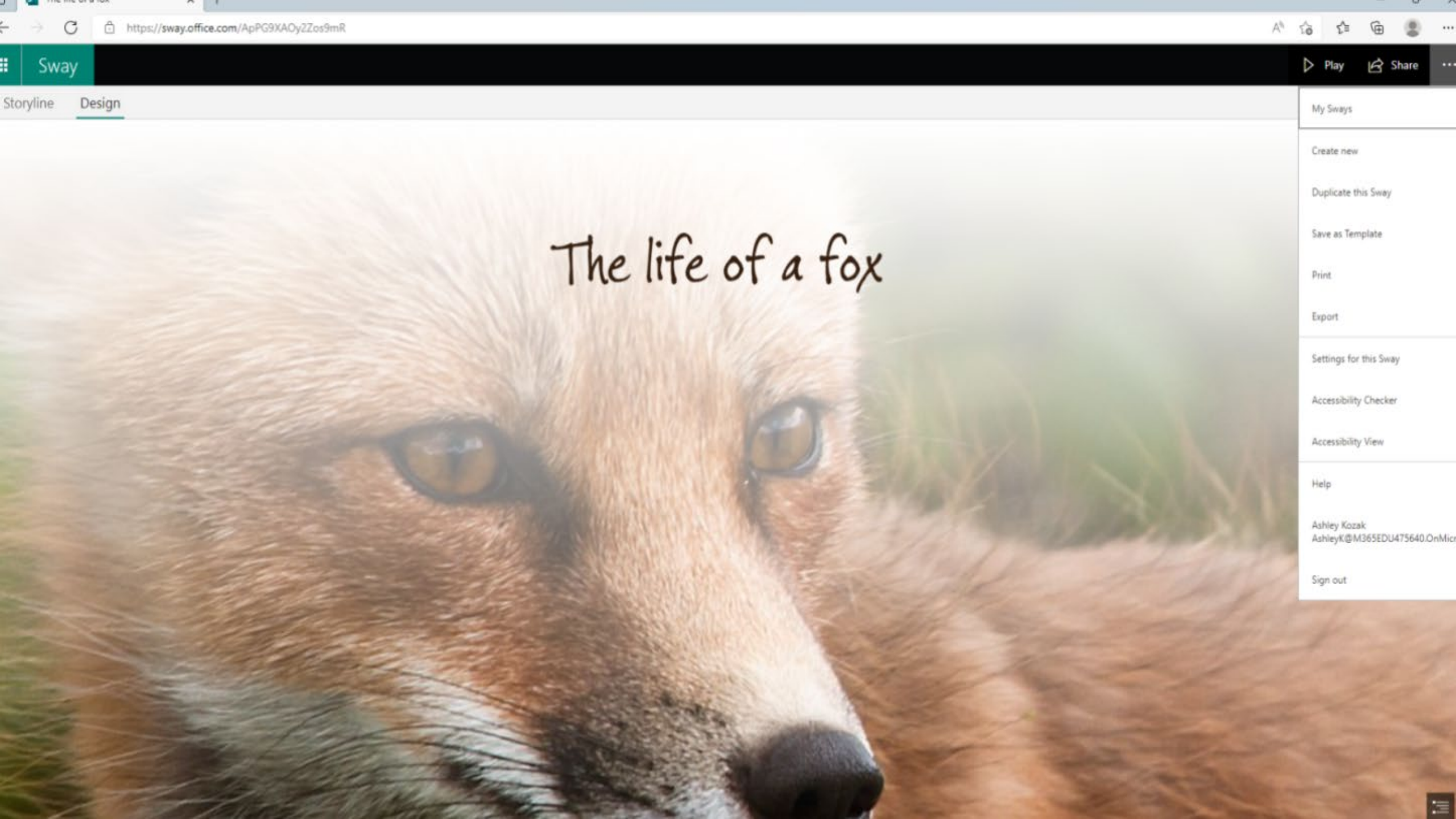
STEP 1: READ (3 Points)

The mid-ocean ridges of the world are connected and form a single global mid-oceanic ridge system that is part of every ocean and the longest mountain range in the world. The continuous mountain range is 65,000 km long.

Additional Information

Why Fix?

Slide titles are used for navigation and selection by those who are not able to view the slide.

Steps To Fix:

Choose the Slide Title command from the Accessibility ribbon tab to set the selected object as the title. If you don't want to set one of the objects on the slide as the title, choose Add Slide Title or Add Hidden Slide Title from the dropdown and type a unique description for the slide.

Tip: you can verify that the slide has a title by looking for the bold text

Student can turn on “Rehearsal mode” with the microphone

Receive on-screen guidance about:

- Pacing: when user talks too fast or too slow
- Disfluency: when user is speaking with filler words such as “um”, “ah”, “basically”, etc.
- Sensitive/inclusive phrases: insensitive phrases that are biased toward people with different gender, disability, race
- Narration: detecting when user is just reading off the slide

At the end of each rehearsal session, the presenter receives a detailed report with metrics for additional practice

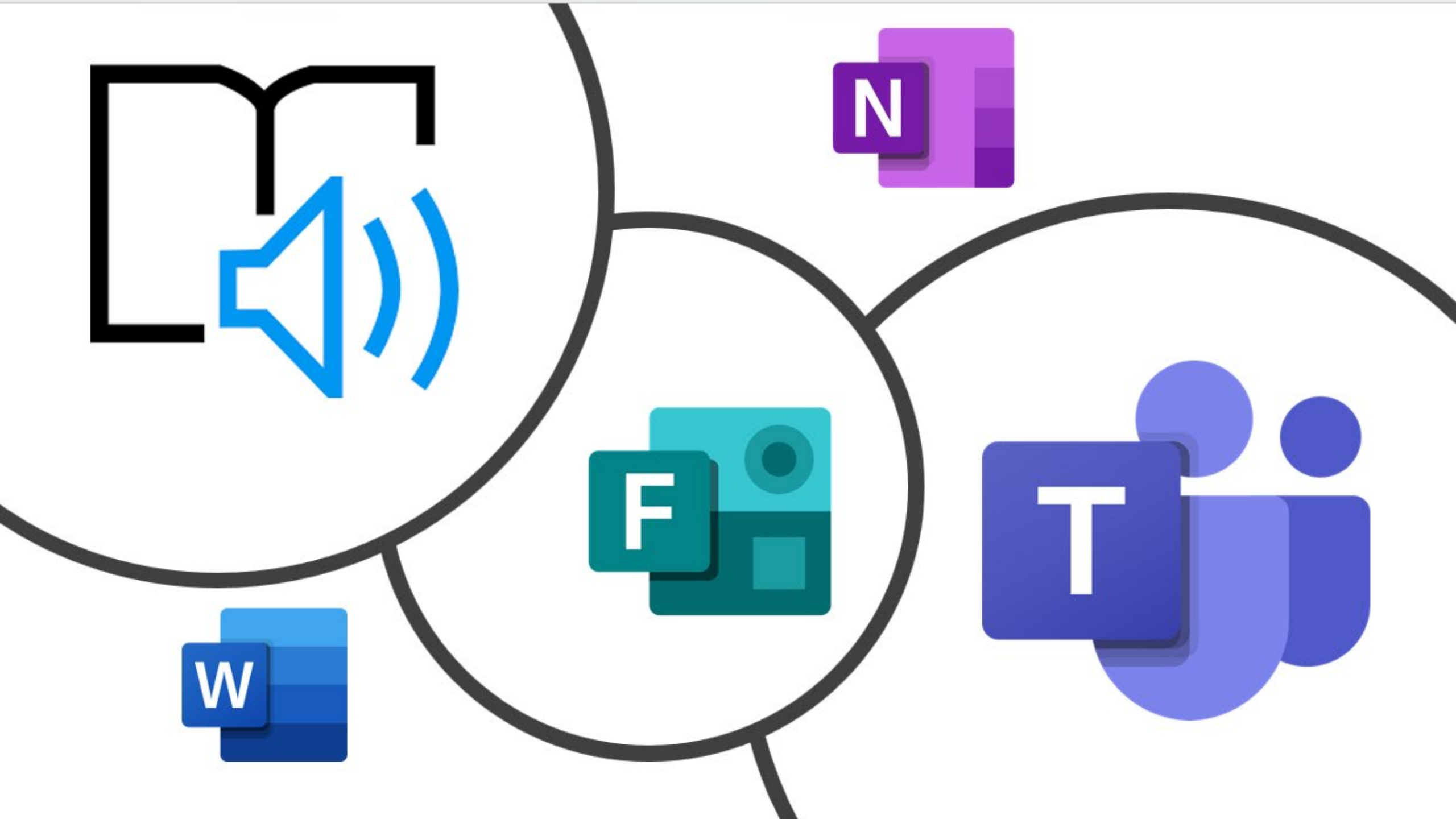

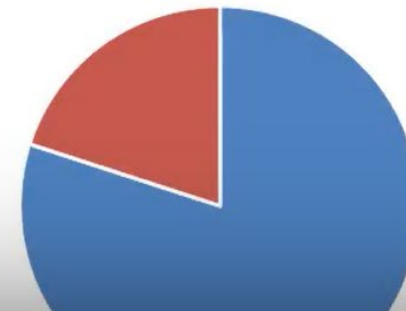


