Successful planning

- 1. Start early
- 2. Incorporate disability specific needs into career planning
- 3. Find out about and utilising career services and graduate opportunities.



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E2E Workshop - The feedback

Feedback	Before	After
Confidence in knowing the unique transition needs of graduates with disabilities	10%	85%
Confidence in knowing where to find more information	15%	79%
Confidence in understanding good transition planning	21%	79%
Confidence about role with swd seeking graduate employment	5%	84%

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E2E Workshop - The feedback

- Increased awareness of resources and support available to assist with transition. Challenged my own perceptions around disability. Dispelled some myths. Good info & resources to share.
- Excellent program with high quality and relevant presenters and participants. I established important contacts which I will follow up.
