



What is effective note-taking?

Capture

- Need to **capture** the information to later **review**

Synthesis

- **Summarising** is key to learning
- Helps recall and long-term retention

Active learning, a key aspect of student engagement, is reduced when students are not directly involved in the process of collecting and sorting information for notes

Note-taking is most effective when done independently








Scribe: transcribe audio with Dragon




